
Georgia O'Keeffe has summoned an audience to help answer the question, "Was it me or was it Stieglitz?". We journey with O'Keeffe from 1915 when she tears up her work to date, and starts over in black and white to discover her own style. She revisits key moments in her life to reveal hidden truths, but the shadow of manager and husband Alfred Stieglitz looms heavy over her. Was it his nude photographs of her that enticed the art world to her, or was it her own excellence of craft? Would she have been noticed if he hadn't exhibited her? Georgia rejects claims by the male dominated art world about what drives her art, but when a Stieglitz affair gets too intense, and a very public commission collapses, her world falls apart. Georgia rallies, determined to survive and paint again, but some difficult decisions must be made. In the end, the truth that lies deep in Georgia's heart is revealed— and it's as devastating as it is honest.

O'Keeffe! is a revealing drama about the beloved and complex American icon.

Stage Management

Performer usually travels with Stage Manager/Sound Op who is performer's husband.

Lights

Plot will be sent upon request. Performer will adjust to venues lighting system. Script with cues will be provided. Available upon request. Stage Mgr. will call cues.

Sound

MP3s provided on a thumb drive for venue's computer system. If needed, performer will provide computer with connectivity. If venue lacks a sound system and performer is driving, performer can potentially provided sound system. Performer will provide 30 minutes of pre-show music (which usually coincides with opening of House), can be lengthened of necessary. There is up to 15 minutes of Intermission music.

Set Items (will need to source if performer is flying)

Hall tree (wooden), simple wooden writing desk with drawer, simple wooden four legged stool, simple wooden/cane, armless chair, woven basket that can hold a violin and drawings, rug (oriental, indigenous, subdued colors, no smaller than 5' x 7')

Stage configuration

O'Keeffe! is designed for flexible staging. The ability to communicate with the audience is best for the show. However, it has been performed on every configuration imaginable including conference rooms and a barn. 3/4 or thrusts are best.

Props

Provided by performer.

Tech/technicians

Venue provides Light Op, performer provides Stage Manager and Sound Op who will run sound and call cues. Required; Technical Advisor with decision making authority for performance space needs to be present and accessible to performer and stage manager at all crew calls, rehearsals, and performances (can also be Light Op).

Technical rehearsal in space for no less than 6 hours preferably day before first show for: load in, set up, focus, cue to cue, tech run-through.

If tech must be day of show (not advised), it must be completed 6 hours prior to first performance.

Backstage crew on headset is preferred but not essential.

All crew at performances must be at tech rehearsal. Performer will endeavor to be flexible.


Dressing Room


A clean, private room with non-public access in close proximity to stage. Needed; adequate lighting, full-length mirror, chair and table, rack for costumes, working iron and board, nearby sink and toilet. Room must be available to performer 3 hours prior to performance and for 1 hour following.

Secure Storage Area

Secure Storage Area Secure storage area needed for storage of properties, set, costume, and makeup items between technical rehearsal and performances.

Creative Team Biographies

Lucinda McDermott (playwright, actor, producer) McDermott is an award winning produced and published playwright with a unique reputation for critically acclaimed creative non-fiction plays and as a deviser/facilitator of original new work. She premiered her solo-actor play about artist Georgia O'Keeffe, O'Keeffe! (with McDermott in the role) in NYC at the William Redfield Theatre, performing it later at Primary Stages and the WomenKind Festival. She has toured and continues to perform O'Keeffe! nationally and internationally. The play is published by Playscripts, Inc., and has and is available for licensing. She has written historically based plays for the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation including facilitating and directing the groundbreaking devised piece Journey to Redemption. She has received play commissions by Birmingham Children's Theatre, Washington & Lee University, Generic Theatre's ChildsPlay, The Chrysler Museum of Art, and The Gibbes Museum of Art, and the History Museum of Hampton, VA on an immersive, interactive production based on a Civil War incident. He has designed and/or operated sound for theatre productions in NYC; Agency at Synchronicity Space, O'Keeffe!(NYC and on tour). Regionally; Copacabana at Mill Mountain Theatre, Red Scare at Sunset (Generic Theatre, Norfolk. The Annual Cabaret for SUSI and The Vagina Monologues at Radford Univ.; Chicago, Playboy of the Western World, An Evening with Bill Irwin, Into the Woods, Hay Fever, Trading Futures, Rivers Run Deep, with compositions written for Who Will Carry the Word?, and Shatter the Vessel all at the UVA. He has operated sound for numerous sound companies and bands including June Rich, Carbon Leaf, Lake Trout, Little Anthony, Louis Christie, Factory Playboys, On Beyond Zee, and Blind Venetians. He is a recording engineer who has worked with a variety of artists. He is currently in the process or recording a new album for Ball & Chain www.ballnchainmusic.com.

<u>Elizabeth Weiss Hopper</u> (Costumer) is an Emeritus Professor of Theatre at the School of the Arts, VCU in Richmond, VA where she served as Head of Costume Design for 32 years. Professionally she has designed costumes for over 300 productions in theatre, dance and opera including the Company of Fools, Hailey, ID; the Confederation Center of the Arts, Canada, the University of Massachusetts, Theatre VCU, Theatre IV, Barksdale Theatre, The Production Company, the University of Richmond, James River Chamber Opera, Richmond Shakespeare, Cadence Theatre, and Virginia Repertory Theatre. She is an expert on 1920's and 1930's women's clothing having co-authored two current books:

Andrea Stratton (Lighting Designer) Andrea loves sitting in dark theaters and creating light scapes. Some of her favorite show designs include: La Sirene (California Revels); She Kills Monsters (San Leandro High School); Almost Maine (B8 Theatre Company, San Leandro High School); A Midsummers Nights Dream (B8 Theatre Company, San Leandro High School); Jubilee (B8 Theatre Company); In the Heights (Throckmorton Theater); Cinderella (Curtain Call Theater Company); Once On this Island (Curtain Call Theater Company), and of course, O'Keeffe! She currently resides at Brava Theater Center as the Technical Director.



Historical Characters in/or referenced in O'Keeffe!

Biographies

Georgia O'Keeffe (1887-1986) Georgia O'Keeffe was an American painter, known as "The Mother of Modern Art". Her work was first exhibited in 1916 at 291, an art gallery owned and operated by Alfred Stieglitz in New York City. She quickly gained prominence as an artist and is best known for her large paintings of flowers, bones, as well as images and landscapes of the American west. She is also well known from the photographs taken of her by her husband Alfred Stieglitz whose images of her totaled over 500 throughout their years together.

Alfred Stieglitz (1864-1946) Photographer and art patron, Stieglitz said of himself, "I was born in Hoboken. I am an American. Photography is my passion. The search for Truth my obsession." Known as "the Father of modern photography", he is credited with introducing modern art to the United States through his galleries 291, The Intimate Gallery, and an American Place. Editor of several photographic journals, most notably 291 and Camera Work, he is best remembered for his intimate photos of his wife, artist Georgia O'Keeffe.

Anita Pollitzer (1894 – 1975) Artist, photographer, womens' rights activist, writer,. Credited for being the first to show Georgia O'Keeffe's artwork to Alfred Stieglitz, who allegedly said, "Finally. A woman on paper." Anita and Georgia exchanged a multitude of correspondence from their days as art students in their twenties at the Art Students League in NYC, through to late adulthood. Georgia once told Anita she should be the one to write her autobiography, "You seem to be on the way to becoming an authority on me", Georgia wrote to Anita in 1950. Anita made it her life's work. When the book was ready for publishing in 1968, O'Keeffe refused to grant permission for publication and threatened litigation if Anita persisted. Pollitzer re-edited per O'Keeffe's critiques, but was unable to please O'Keeffe . Although O'Keeffe followed up with thirty or so hand-written notes, Pollitzer discontinued work on the book, and communication with O'Keeffe. Following this her nephew wrote, "Anita seemed to lose something of her lust for life." After her husband passed in 1971, her health declined till her death in 1975.

<u>Jean Toomer</u> (1894 -1967) Novelist, poet. Toomer became known as a writer following the publishing of his novel *Cane* in 1923. As such he became connected to the Harlem Renaissance, but Toomer expressed resistance to the connection. Of mixed race, he resisted being labeled black, and sought to be labeled "American." He was part of Stieglitz's Avant Garde circle, which is where he came to know O'Keeffe. In the early 1932 his wife Marjorie Latimer died from complications in childbirth. This was at the same time O'Keeffe was suffering a major emotional breakdown. Letters reveal that the time they spent together during this difficult period for both, was mutually healing.

William Merritt Chase (1849-1916) American painter/teacher. Taught O'Keeffe at The Art Students League.

John Vanderpoel (1857-1911) Dutch-American artist/teacher. Taught O'Keeffe at the Art Institute of Chicago.

Alon Bement (1876-1953) Artist/teacher. Taught O'Keeffe at UVA.

<u>Arthur Wesley Dow (</u>1857-1922) Painter, printer, photographer, arts educator. Taught O'Keeffe at Columbia University Teachers College.

Arthur Dove(1880-1946) Painter, Stieglitz Circle. Often considered first American abstract painter

Marsden Hartley (1877-1943) Modernist painter, poet, essayist. Part of the Stieglitz Circle.

Charles Demuth (1883–1935) Modernist painter. Part of the Stieglitz Circle.

<u>Waldo Frank (1889-1967)</u> American novelist, historian, political activist, literary critic. Writer for *The New Yorker*, and *The New Republic*. Part of Stieglitz's Avante Garde Circle.

Paul Rosenfeld (1890-1946) American journalist and music critic. Part of Stieglitz's Avante Garde Circle.

<u>D.H. Lawrence</u> (1885-1930) British writer, poet. Wrote; *Sons and Lovers, The Rainbow, Women in Love*, and *Lady Chatterley's Lover*. Part of Stieglitz's Avante Garde Circle.

Mabel Dodge Luhan (1879-1962) Wealthy and well connected patron of the arts with far reaching

connections. Started an artists' colony in Taos. Part of Stieglitz's Avante Garde Circle.

Georgia O'Keeffe is back from the dead to reclaim her legacy, but there's a lifetime of complications in the way. As Georgia revisits her past, domineering photographer Alfred Stieglitz swoops in to propel her to greatness . . . or was he holding her back? As their relationship explodes, so does her identity as the press, the world, and Stieglitz all try to lay claim. O'Keeffe! shows a woman's passion at its sharpest, reminding us that a balance between life and art is a lie.

The play premiered Off-Broadway in 1992 at Primary Stages with McDermott in the title role. She has toured it throughout the USA to universities, theatres, arts centers, and museums. She performed the play alongside an O'Keeffe exhibit in Bermuda, and at the San Miguel International Writer's Conference in Mexico. The play is published through Playscripts, Inc., (playscripts.com) and has been performed by other actors throughout the world.

McDermott is a Touring Artist with the Virginia Commission of the Arts, an elite roster of curated touring performances within the Commonwealth. She is also a Teaching Artist for VCA, facilitating workshops in acting and playwriting. She is a member of Actors Equity Association and the Dramatists Guild of America. She has performed Off-B'way, onstage elsewhere in NYC, regionally and in London's West End. She has worked in film, TV, in numerous commercials and voice-overs.

As a playwright her many plays have been produced in theatres and universities nationally including Primary Stages, William Redfield Theatre, WomenKind Festival in New York City, Center for Sacred Story in Los Angeles, Barter Theatre, Birmingham Children's Theatre, Theatre of Albany in Georgia, Univ. of Wisconsin, and many more. McDermott has written, directed, devised, and collaborated on original scripts for Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, Hampton History Museum, The Chrysler Museum of Fine Arts, Mill Mountain Theatre, and more.

She holds an MFA in Playwriting from the Univ. of Virginia, BFA in acting from Virginia Commonwealth Univ. She has taught at a variety of universities including Washington & Lee Univ., Radford Univ., VA Tech, VA Commonwealth Univ., Old Dominion Univ., Hampton Univ. Page to Stage:

Adaptations.

Novels tell a lot, and through the words used they ignite our imagination. Plays use action and dialogue. Less is more on the stage, we want to see what's happening, not to be told what's happening. The challenge for the novelist in adapting for the stage is a different editing process. McDermott, an award winning playwright and teacher of playwriting will take you through exercises and give examples of how to make your words come alive sculpturally. Materials required: Bring examples of your writing and whatever means of writing is comfortable for you—laptop, or paper and pen.

Breath Awareness Acting Technique

This organic acting technique is based on Lucinda's extensive training with actor Michael Moriarty in New York, and informed by her training at HB Studios in Method, other training with Meisner, and infused with her own experiences. This technique does not negate other performance approaches, but rather provides a structure and base for the actor to develop their own technique, while gaining control over their instrument.

Devising workshops

How do you create a group collaborative performance piece from nothing? Lucinda will take the group through the process in abbreviated form. Writing, Acting, group/team building, a structure for discerning worth and editing is addressed. Dependent upon number of participants, their trust with one another, and time. Lucinda is also available as a facilitator for a long term project.

The best way to determine the best workshop is to collaborate on what your organization needs. Lucinda is an experienced teaching artist who can customize a workshop to fit your particular and unique needs.
